Removing Toolbars

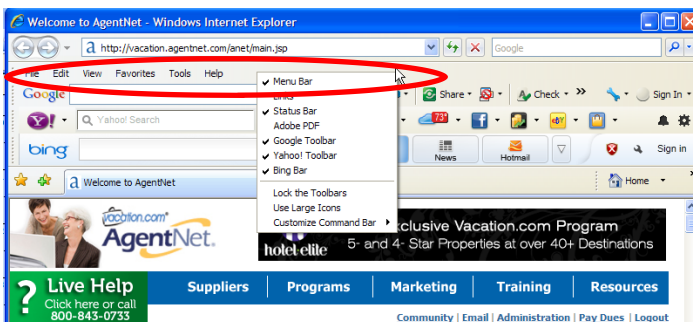

I have all these toolbars on my browser and I cannot see anything, how do I get rid of them?

Sometimes toolbars get downloaded on accident and can take up valuable window real estate. You have two options, you can stop viewing the toolbar or you can uninstall it. Follow the instructions below for your desired resolution.

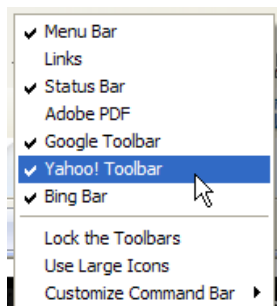
Stop Viewing the Toolbar

1) If you have one or several toolbars on your screen, you can temporarily remove them (for that window) by right



clicking on the menu bar.

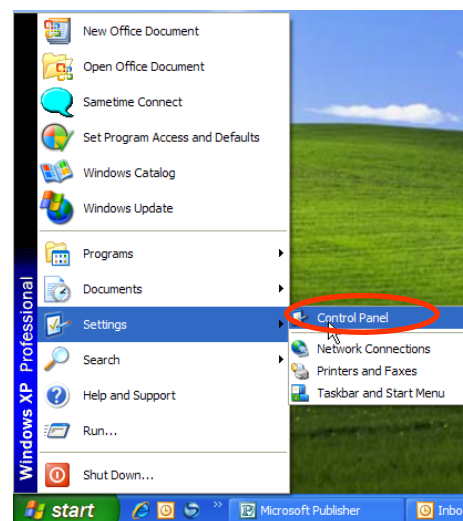
2) A list of the items currently included in your toolbar area are listed. Items that appear are indicated with a check mark. To hide something from view, click on it. This will remove the check mark and remove it from your toolbar.



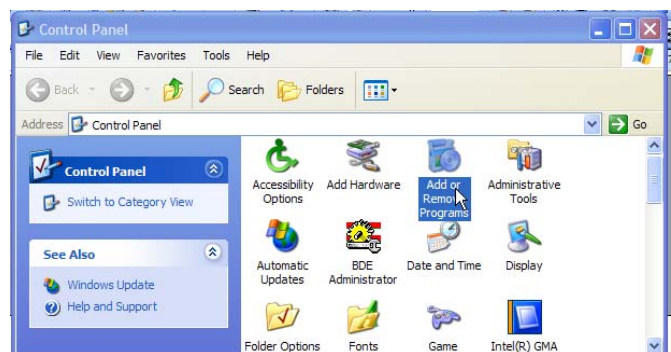
Uninstalling Toolbars in Windows XP/2000

1) Click the "Start" menu.

2) Access the "Control Panel" or if you are in the Classic View of the Start bar, click "Settings," then select "Control Panel."



3) Select "Add or Remove Programs"



4) A list of all your installed programs appears. Scroll until you find the toolbar you would like to uninstall, then click on it and select "Remove/Uninstall."



5) Most likely, a dialogue box will open and lead you through the uninstall process or you will be prompted to respond to a survey. Complete the steps and you'll be done.
